Burgundy

 good value alternative for a more flavoursome Chablis from a famed Burgundy House. Wonderful aromas of white flowers, lime, blossom, vanilla and toffee. This is a fresh and generous white

 appealing citrus and floral aromas, elegantly dry with delicate mineral notes

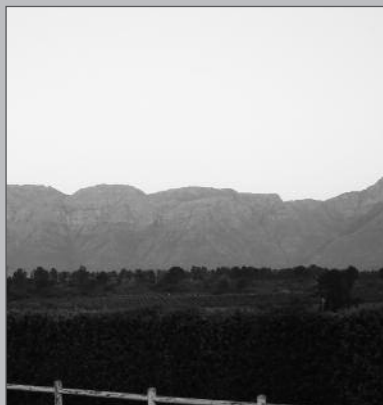

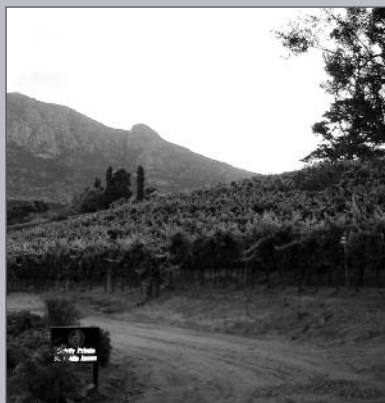

 dark cherry in colour, it is bursting full of fruit flavours, with a lovely balance of vanilla and cinnamon from the oak. This wine is one to savour and to enjoy with any red meat and rich sauces

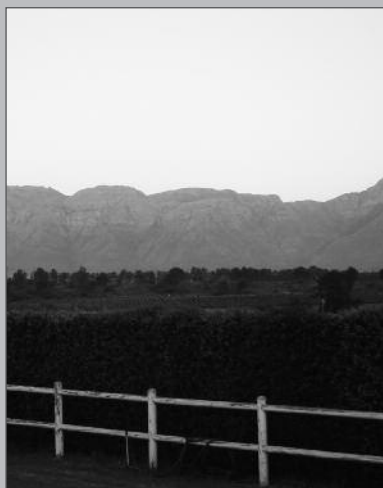

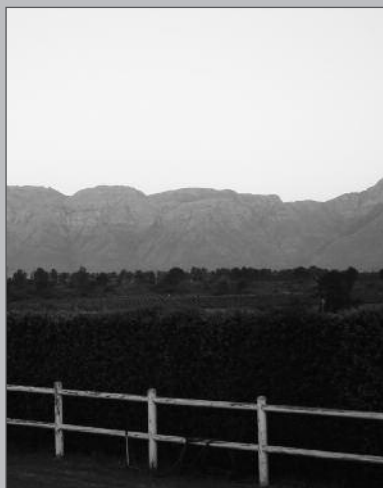
